Good afternoon,

In this regard, please note that there are two basic conditions for a foreign plated vehicle to circulate legally:

1. The vehicle's license plates must be current and valid, and
2. There must be at least one person on board who is a resident abroad. This person does not necessarily have to be the driver.

However, if all occupants of the vehicle are permanent residents in Mexico, at least one of them must be able to prove that they also maintain residency abroad.

Such residency abroad may be accredited through supporting documentation, including but not limited to:

Any employment letter issued abroad;

Recent tax returns filed in another country;

Mortgage documentation;

Utility bills.

This documentation is required in order to demonstrate that the person also qualifies as a resident outside of Mexico.
